



He gave us a tip to always carry a cup at a party (so no one will offer you a drink you don't want). Keep a distance for safety of 7 or 8 ft. from someone you are unsure of; put your hand over your mouth and tell someone you have the Covid bug if you want them to go away. And finally, to shout, "Back off. I don't know you!" if someone is trying to harm you in public.



Living in Austria during Hitler's Campaign
Paul Shwartzbart

Paul A. Schwarzbart, husband, father, respected teacher, survivor of the Holocaust, was born in



Vienna in 1933. He was just 4 years old and living in Austria with his parents when Hitler began his campaign to conquer Europe and exterminate undesirables, in particular the Jewish. Paul shared with us what the next decade was like living through that nightmare.

He fled with his parents when Austria was annexed, at the end of 1938. After his father's arrest, he was hidden in a Catholic boys' school in the Belgian Ardennes. Some ten years later, he and his mother came to the United States. He eventually received his undergraduate and graduate degrees at UC Berkeley. His teaching career spanned 45 years. He has spoken well over 500 times in various venues recounting his life experiences as a hidden child. In 1988 Schwarzbart's life became the central theme of an award-winning Ken Swartz documentary, SHATTERED DREAMS, A Child of the Holocaust.





The catastrophic flooding of New Orleans 15 years ago brought levees into the public conscience. Now flooding seems to be a problem almost



everywhere. Much of the nation's population lives in counties protected by levees.

Our speaker this month was Sandy Rosenthal. She is the founder of the major nonprofit, <u>Levees.org</u> – which has 25,000 supporters and chapters in five states. She did this after she and her family were evacuated from the New Orleans flooding from Hurricane Katrina.

Sandy's new book – "Words Whispered in Water", which is also the topic of her talk today, is about how she changed the national narrative on how the flooding disaster in 2005 classified as an act of Mother Nature is more likely a federal civil engineering mistake.

In March of 2019, Sandy Rosenthal unveiled the first of its kind, Flooded House Museum at the site of a major levee breach. She hosts an annual guided Levee Breach Bike Tour. These are just a couple of the sustainable ways that she separates fact from fiction.

For those efforts, Sandy has been honored with numerous awards including most recently "Outstanding Social Entrepreneur of the Year" from Tulane University in 2018, and also "Most Influential Woman" by Mount Holyoke College. She is an advocate for the 63% of the American population living in counties protected by levees.

Sandy's been married to Stephen Rosenthal since 1979, has three adult children and one granddaughter. She also has two small dogs named Twinkie and Cupcake.
