## **BRIDGE UPDATE**



Our Speaker for April 20th, 2017 is Willard (Bill) Gillette who flew P- 51's during WWII. His topic is: The D-Day Invasion and WWII. He has an interesting story about his not knowing about the plans leading to escorting the ships to Normandy until they were told to report for a briefing at midnight, flying out at 3AM with orders to follow the ships. He has a CD of films taken from his plane downing several German planes in dog fights. They were taken from a camera mounted on the plane working when the guns are fired. Bill flew on 59 missions. He also flew into Russia and Italy before returning home.

Bill is now 98 years old, and is a member of Branch 21. He still golfs and drives and is very healthy.

Incidentally, he explained that the D on D-Day was for Plan D. The other plans were A, B and C.

Speaking at Br. 104, he attracted the biggest attendance ever for their luncheons! Let's beat them!
