

There is no message from the Big Sir for this month. The following is a repeat of the status of our search for a suitable restaurant from last month's newsletter.

Fellow Sirs:

The situation at Mariani's has not changed for several months. The latest proposal by the developer is a 5-story apartment complex and a 5-story hotel. It was presented to the Planning Commission, the City Council and summarized in the local Santa Clara weekly paper. It will cover all of Mariani's and the area to the west, from the road all the way up to the creek. Sooner or later (most likely sooner), the developer will come up with a plan that is acceptable to the city

I have been told that all of Mariani's will not go away. There will still be a restaurant and some meeting rooms. However, there may be an extended period during "renovations" that we will not have a place to meet. It appears that Mariani's is not long for this world and we better find a solution soon--- probably by year's end. We are investigating several options that would bring us back to Sunnyvale, which is where most of the membership lives.

Right now, there are possibilities but nothing firm. One candidate is the new restaurant at the Sunnyvale Golf Course. They have plenty of room but the food would be somewhat different than what we have had in the past-- more like sandwiches and salads etc. and the price is \$28.00. We would have to buy audio and video equipment as they have none. Another possibility is the Sunnyvale Community Center at Braly Park. We would have to arrange our own caterer there and we may need a setup and clean up committee, if the caterer does not do that. More information will be presented at our next meeting. Keep your eyes and ears open. These options may not be acceptable. If you have a thought on the subject, please give me a call.
