Romance of the Rhine & Mosel River Cruise July 6 – July 21, 2025

We are setting up a cruise of the Rhine and Mosel Rivers from Basel, Switzerland to Antwerp,. Belgium. We cruise by many fine castles, towns and sights such as the Lorelei rock, with stops in Strasbourg. Speyer, Boppard, Bernkastel and Trier (on the Mosel), Cochem, Bonn, Nijmegen, Willemstad, ending in Antwerp, Belgium. Prices (pp. double occupancy) start at \$6345 going to \$7445 or \$7645 for top deck with a balcony. Prices include round-trip air fare from SFO. Single supplement is \$895. There is a 4 day pretrip to Lucerne, Switzerland for \$1295/person and a 3 day post- trip to Bruges, Belgium for \$995/person available. Discounts are available for early sign-up and early payment.
