Homeward Bound has also assumed responsibility for running and renovating the Casa Buena Motel in Corte Madera that was purchased by the County of Marin for housing of our marginal citizens currently living without secure housing. I attended the open house and was very impressed with the living quarters which included upgraded bathrooms and a newly installed kitchenette. Corry is the Development Director for Homeward Bound and was responsible for overseeing the renovation of the motel and helping to select clients with the greatest chance of success in the new facility. She worked closely with the Town of Corte Madera to make the transition from run down motel to a successful housing unit a success. We can also ask her about her transition from curator of the Norman Rockwell Museum in Sacramento to Development Director for Homeward Bound.
