**BIG SIR**—Bob Bundy



To my knowledge we have not had a medical presentation to SIRS since I have been a member. As a former Emergency Physician who looks back over the past forty years of medical progress it has been an amazing transition. When I did my internship there was no CT scan, MRI, PET scan, ultrasound or laparoscopic surgery. In my early years I would admit patients to the hospital not knowing the diagnosis and in spite of our primitive diagnostic tools some of them would have surgery to see what was the underlying problem. Toward the end of my career patients would come in with a headache and I would need to inform them they had a brain tumor and were scheduled for going be surgery.

Prostate cancer was often diagnosed when metastatic symptoms became apparent and the treatment was not very effective. Prostate specific antigen (PSA) became the diagnostic test several decades ago, but it was not diagnostic and a biopsy is always necessary to confirm cancer. At that time both the biopsy and treatment including radical surgery had many complications so there was a protocol established that testing should only be performed on men up to a certain age, usually seventy. After seventy prostate cancer tends to be less aggressive and slower to spread but that was assuming you would not live another ten years. My PSA had been normal and according to the protocol I had not had one for several years, but I became concerned about the possibility of prostate cancer due to some non-specific symptoms (prostate cancer is usually asymptomatic) and pushed my doctor to order the PSA. Mine was elevated and led to a biopsy which confirmed cancer and I have now been success-

Minutes of the July 20<sup>th</sup> Branch Executive Committee meeting:



fully treated with external beam radiation and my urologist assures me I will die of something else. Fortunately, there have been great advances in the biopsy technique as well as the focused radiation so side effects were minimal and I felt normal within two weeks of completing therapy. Since the diagnosis I have been carrying around a soapbox and telling all my male friends to forget the protocol and if you are healthy and expect to live another five years you should insist of having a PSA as a routine screening. I am not the only man in SIRS who has had this diagnosis because it is said to affect one in six men but if diagnosed early it is very treatable. Have an annual physical and insist on a PSA every one or two years.
