Minutes of the last Board Meeting of Oct 19 were approved as reported.

Al Wuthnow gave the treasurer's report. He said our bank balance is \$6,300 but is decreasing due to not covering the lunch expenses with money collected. In addition, Erik Jensen, manager of Club Restaurant, will be increasing the cost of our lunches to \$35/pp starting in January. Ted Pullen moved to increase the amount we charge members for monthly lunches to \$38. This motion was approved.

Kelley Reid presented an application for membership from John Davis, a civil engineer. His membership was approved. Dick Robinson has ordered a supply of hats and pins for Kelley to give to new members. Dr Bundy and Michael Sommer are working on a sign to post outside the restaurant during our monthly meetings. The idea is to promote membership in our Branch of Sirs.

Ted discussed plans for the Christmas Lunch on December 7 which will include ladies. He is taking reservations and checks for this party. Ted also asked for donations of prizes for the raffle. Ken Kauer will be selling raffle tickets at 6 for \$5, 13 for \$10 and 30 for \$20. Wine and drinks will be available to purchase before lunch and wine will be provided at the tables. The cost is \$55/pp for prime rib and \$45/pp for salmon or pasta. Ted is also planning a Valentine's Day party in February to include ladies.
