


Pop-the-Cork

Tim Tarazi - Why I Decided to Immigrate to the U.S.

On completing my studies as a foreign student and graduating from the University of Detroit, it was time to go back to Lebanon where my parents took residence.



I quickly found a job in Beirut and at that time in 1975 it was called Paris of the Middle East ... a vibrant city just what someone like me would enjoy bachelor days.

It was unfortunately short-lived. Within three months a civil war was brewing, and turmoil ensued. Several political factions became uncontrolled. Riots, gun fire, kidnapping became a daily occurrence. Going to work was sometimes risky. Out of nowhere, roads were closed in some districts and danger loomed all over the city.

One day when the atmosphere seemed to have calmed down, we received word from our employer that something big was in the works and urged everyone to go home.

It was a midday in September, when I was heading back home that I was I faced a blockade in the main street that would lead me to my parents' house.

Cars where being stopped, and identifications checked. A 15-year-old boy carrying a machine gun came to me and ordered me to open the window and pointed his machine gun right at my temple. I remember keeping my calm and did not panic. He asked me for my ID and noticing the dialect he spoke indicated to me what faction he belonged to. Luckily, I was able to communicate with him in the same dialect. Just at that moment, across the other side of the boulevard a kidnapping was taking place. I then heard someone saying: Let's go we got our man.

As soon as that happened, life became normal again and I managed to continue my trek going home.

It was one of the scariest moments of my life that I swore I was not going to stay in Beirut and managed to leave the country to go to Jordan where I had relatives.

I decided that living in the US suits me more than having to worry about my own life due to some political uprisings which ended up being a civil war lasting more than 25 years.

So, I applied for immigration to the US that took several years but it finally happened in 1986 when my wife and family moved to America.

The Sterling tour is scheduled for March 16 at 11:00am. There will be a short slide show at our meeting on February 9 to show you the layout and what to expect.





SIR visit to LCS-102 at Mare Island - February 16 @ 1:00pm

The LCS-102 is a landing craft support ship and was launched in 1945 and participated in the Battle of Okinawa. She is 160 feet long and originally carried 8 officers and 70 men. They were heavily armored and gained the nickname "Mighty Midgets."

After the war she was transferred to the Japanese Maritime Self Defense Force and later to the Royal Thai Navy, They named her Nakha and she served with Thailand until 2007. The Royal Thai Navy transferred the ship to the Landing Craft Support group and requested that the name Nakha continued to be used. Dr. Bill Mason, a Professor at UC San Francisco had served with similar ships facilitated the move to Mare Island. Dr. Mason (who is in his 90's and lives in San Francisco) is considered the Captain and the Executive Officer is Gordon Stutrud, who lives in Vallejo. The ship is entirely supported by donations from the national association and visitors (free admission). The all-volunteer crew are continually working to maintain the ship and allow visitation by young and old alike.

The ship is now known as the Landing Craft Support Museum. They have a good website @ https://www.usslcs102.org/ with drone views and much information.

SIR members will drive by themselves to the free parking lot next to the ship by 1:00pm on Thursday, February 16.

The ship is located on Mare Island, 289 Waterfront Avenue. Drive across the Mare Island Bridge and take a left on Nimitz Avenue, then turn left on "A" Street. Signs are posted. Admission is free but they do have a donation box.
