


That's about it for *My Two Cents* this month. Be safe and stay healthy.



Cribbage is still going strong. We fluctuate between five and nine players each week. But no matter the number, it is always a fun crowd.



Men's Poker -



In April, we changed the format of the wine group a little bit and selected a country for our focus. We tasted various wines and




foods native to Italy, the first country we selected. Our group of eight sipped Chianti, Prosecco, and Dolcetto.
