
Games are going into the fourth week of this season, and we are

Member Spotlight Sanford Gladding

The US Navy paid for me to attend Brown University. In return I was required to serve for four years. I started on a destroyer, the USS Mullinix, which was sent to escort a Russian vessel from Cuba back to the USSR. This was part of the operation in the Cuban missile crisis. I was then transferred to the USS Shakori, an ocean-going tug, based in Norfolk, VA. As the Executive Officer, I had the responsibility of Navigation. During the early days of the Vietnam war, ships were being sunk in Saigon Harbor to disrupt navigation. Although the Americans did not have any, the British had "lifting craft", left over from Suez Canal clearance in WWII, which were needed for harbor clearance. Our ship was directed to proceed to Rosyth Scotland with an en route stop at Argentia, Newfoundland. We towed our craft astern through significant squalls. passing Gibraltar, into the Mediterranean. Our next stop for a little R and R in Greece, Off again to Egypt and a transit of the Suez Canal. We passed by Saudi Arabia and headed for our

next rest stop in Trincomale, Ceylon. We delivered our craft to our Navy counterparts in Vietnam and headed north for a rest stop in Yokosuka, Japan. Heading south we encountered heavy seas and rain, making navigation very difficult. (No GPS yet!) Using a sextant we charted one line from Canada to Australia, and another from China to South America. Where the lines crossed is approximately where we were! When we sighted the first lighthouse north of the Hawaiian Islands, the Captain and I were very relieved. A stop in Hawaii, and off to San Diego. Then south through the Panama Canal, and north to home. We had travelled a total of 27,173 miles in 198 days. So I truly circumnavigated the globe! I have always been most proud of that trip!

Barbara and I have been happily married for 58 years. We have three children and seven grands. They all live not too far away. I have enjoyed all of the friends I have met through SIRS. Life is good.




