How it Works:




Membership Message

Treasurer's Report -

We finished last year with \$3,392 in our treasury, compared to \$5,625 at the beginning of the year.

The decrease is a result of not charging dues last year, as well as subsidizing the extra cost of \$1,100 for the upgraded December luncheon.

Our 2022 branch budget is based on 130 paid memberships; to date only 38 have paid their annual dues of \$20. Ghost Ships of the Gold Rush: Why are they there? ... and how to find them. 

Anyone who wishes to help in pulling names at random for the teams is welcome to assist.


Basketball - Golden State Warriors Tickets –

How do you check out the lane conditions during practice? You shoot at four different pins ... 7 pin, 10 pin, 2 pin and the strike pocket. Check how your ball reacts shooting at these pins. You must adjust to the right or left to hit the pin squarely.

This will work if your delivery is correct, as it takes consistency in your ball delivery.
