Our treasury is in good shape. We began the year with \$3,192 in the bank. Our current



balance is \$5,347, having collected \$2,600 in dues year-to-date ... 130 paid memberships.

The only significant near-term expense is our quarterly assessment of \$240, due this month. Last month the board voted to host a holiday party in December, based in part on our financial solvency.

Luncheon attendance has been down for the past few months, running about 45. I anticipate that we will see better turnout as we move into fall and winter months.








Bocce Ball (Men) -
