New SIR's Covid Protocols are posted in this newsletter. Please review (page 3).





COVID Protocol from State

(Revised May 30, 2022)



Below are some relevant excerpts from the State SIR's COVID Protocols just passed on May 30, 2022. Since insurance companies have decided to no longer cover any COVID related lawsuits, we need policies to limit our liability and keep SIRs from going out of existence. The major change in the new policy is the elimination of the need for you to sign a waiver. This is no longer considered necessary and will reduce administrative effort for branches.

Branch Protocols for COVID-19 LIABILITY (Updated 5/19/22)*

- 1) Branches shall require branch members, all Attendees at functions:
 - a) to be fully vaccinated (2 shots, if required) as a condition of being allowed to attend branch activities which are conducted wholly or partially indoors or,
 - b) as an alternative, unvaccinated Attendees can attend such activities if they provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test administered within 3 days prior to the event. Self-administered test results are acceptable with the member's signed statement that the results are his.
- 2) Branches shall require Attendees to show the original, a copy, or photo (in hardcopy or via a phone) of their vaccination record cards or test result documentation.
- 3) Branches shall maintain an updated list of members who have submitted proof of vaccination and use it to check them in for branch activities involving any indoor components. Branches need not require members who are on the vaccinated list to show proof of vaccination thereafter.
- 4) Branches shall require all Attendees participating in SIR activities to comply with all then-current state and county requirements related to COVID-19 protection, such as wearing masks and social distancing.


Also, our league rules were modified and approved.


