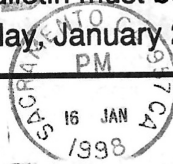
SPECIAL NOTICE A State Law prohibits smoking on the buses and will have to be enforced. Periodic stops will be made en route.

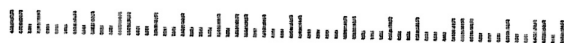
