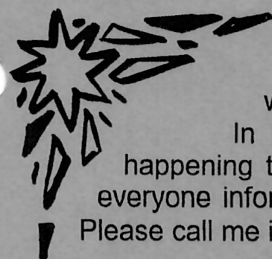
LITTLE SIR Tom Gamble 677-7764

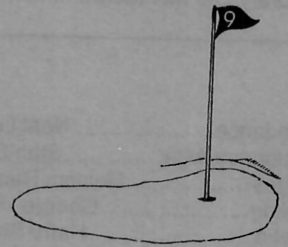

The District Governor has asked that the attendance and travel rules be distributed in the monthly bulletin.
