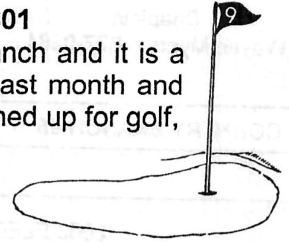
**SUNSHINE CORNER Marv Smith (916) 933-4364**
