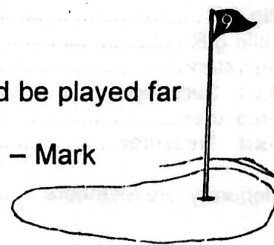

Golf Wisdoms

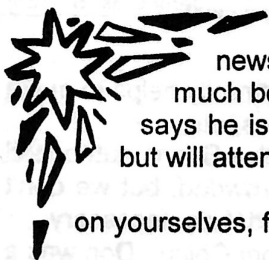
