We are working on a proposal to submit for approval to restart golf activities.

I have not ventured far in the past six weeks. Every other month a run to Costco and every two weeks a grocery run, a couple of short stops for pick up food and some walks on the trails by our house has been most of my outings. But hopefully the measures we take now will pay off and allow us to get back to activities sooner with less chance of having to repeat this process again. I hope everyone takes care of themselves and those they love and stay strong and healthy.




