MEMBER ATTENDANCE:

To maintain membership, a member is required to attend one-half of the regular Branch monthly luncheon meetings within the previous twelve consecutive month period, unless the Branch BEC has approved different attendance requirements (Policy 25; Bylaw 18). This time we will be looking outside of our immediate environment and even into the very space beyond our world.

Joining us will be Dr. Alex Filippenko, Professor of Astronomy at the University of California, Berkeley. His presentation covers some of his cutting-edge research on stars exploding at the end of their stellar evolution, earth-like planets orbiting other stars, and giant black holes (one of the most mysterious and researched phenomena in astrophysics this century). Mush of this study, public service, and student training is being done at the Lick Observatory at Mount Hamilton, near San Jose. Since Lick is only partially funded by the UC Administration, he is more than happy to expand on the opportunities and technology available to support the vibrant efforts ongoing at Lick.

Alex brings a unique blend of researcher, teacher, and communicator to the general population about advances in astronomy. As an example, and as an elected member of the National Academy of Sciences, he is one of the world's most highly cited astronomers discovering the Nobel-worthy accelerating expansion of the Universe. He was voted UC Berkeley's "Best Professor" a record nine times; he appears frequently on TV documentaries; and is addicted to observing total solar eclipses (17 so far).

We are truly fortunate to have Alex make a presentation to us. Whatever the aspect of astronomy, it will be informative, authoritative, and entertaining.

They require one payment for a group like ours, but the new COVID-19 policy states that no money can be collected on site by the tournament director. We have a solution that has been agreed to by Mather that will allow our members to pay on site and allow me to make one payment for Sir 95 and still not have contact between us.



Did You Know? - Big SIR Kevin King

We often hear about the "dog days" of summer but few may know what the expression means. Some say that it signifies hot sultry days "not fit for a dog," others suggest it's the weather in which dogs go mad. The Dog Days of Summer describes the most oppressive period of summer, between July 3rd and August 11th each year. But where did the term come from? And what does it have to do with dogs?

The phrase is actually a reference to the fact that, during this time, the Sun occupies the same region of the sky as Sirius, the brightest star visible from any part of Earth and part of the constellation Canis Major, the Greater Dog. This is why Sirius is sometimes called the Dog In the summer, Star. Sirius rises and sets with the Sun. On July 23rd, specifically. it is in conjunction with the Sun, and because the star is so



bright, the ancient Romans believed it actually gave off heat and added to the Sun's warmth, accounting for the long stretch of sultry weather. They referred to this time as *diēs caniculārēs*, or "dog days." Thus, the term Dog Days of Summer came to mean the 20 days before and 20 days after this alignment of Sirius with the Sun—July 3 to August 11.

Aren't you glad you asked? Thanks to the Farmers' Almanac for clearing this up for us.
