SIR State Meeting – Big SIR Kevin King

I, along with about 130 other Big SIRs as well as State, Area and Regional officials, attended the State meeting on August 19th via Zoom. Following are some of the meeting highlights that may be of interest to you:

- The following individuals were elected to serve on the State Board for the coming year:
 - o President Jim Johnson (Sonora; former State Vice

President)

- Assistant Treasurer Ron Saltgiver (Livermore; State forms Chairman)
- Chief Administrative Officer Dean Steichen (Danville; previous CAO)
- As you know, a portion of the dues the branch assesses each member each year goes to the State. This is largely used by the State to cover insurance, administrative expenses, and travel. The State Treasurer reported a slight surplus of about \$9,000 for the year largely due to less travel costs. Like all the Branches, the State is relying more on Zoom to conduct its business.
- There remains an outstanding lawsuit against one of our Branches in the Bay Area.
- The State anticipates industry-wide insurance adjustments related to COVID when our insurance renews next Spring.
- A number of by-law changes were approved that dealt with the ability to hold meetings and conduct business by electronic media (e.g., Zoom), the Branch requirement to submit a membership roster annually to the State and the State's ability to pass temporary by-law changes without them first being ratified by the Branches when the State considers them to be in the best interest of the organization (an example might be having the ability to have electronic meetings and elections)...
