The golf season is rapidly coming to a close. In September, we held our three-round Club Championship tournaments. We played one round at Mather, one at Wildhawk and one at Empire Ranch. The Club Champion was determined by the qualified golfer (having

played at least 10 rounds of SIR 95 golf this season) having the lowest cumulative score played over the three rounds. All of the results are on the Branch 95 website.

Taking the Club Championship for 2022 is Bill Yeager. Bill had rounds of 65, 75 and 65 for a total of 205 points. His trophy presentation will be at the November SIR luncheon. Bill will also receive \$50 cash prize money. In second place for the Club Championship this year was Peter Apel. He will be receiving \$30 cash prize at the luncheon. In third place was Dan Link, winning \$25 cash in prize money and in fourth pace was Dan Cockcroft, winning \$20 cash in prize money.

We still have two competitions going to the end of the year. The SIR Branch 95 Gold Country Cup and the Marksman of the Year. Through 9/27, Dan Cockcroft leads the Gold Country Cup by 3 points over Lew Chapman and Tim Irish. This award is for the player that has consistently scored in the top three places in our weekly tournaments. The Marksman of the Year is being led by Tim Irish who has a 1 point advantage over three golfers tied for 2nd. This competition rewards scoring closest to the pin the most number of times during the season. With nine rounds remaining this year, there's plenty of time to make a run up both leaderboards.



So, I will not set up the book exchange on the morning of Wednesday, October 12th. Look for it again at the November luncheon.

Inasmuch as Halloween happens at the end of the month, I thought I would write about scary books, the Steven King type. I'm not much of a suspense or thriller reader, so I did some research and found out these things.

- The bestselling thriller, mystery or suspense novel of all time is *Blue Moon* by Lee Child, 2019, with over 5 million copies sold.
- Coming in second is a recent book, 2021 named *Project Hail Mary* by Andy Weir, who also wrote *The Martian* (good movie too with Matt Damon) which sold over 2 million copies.
- Third is *The Stand* by Stephen King, 2012, having sold over 2 million copies.

Honestly, I have never read or even heard about any of these, so I'll have to go get a copy of Blue Moon and later add it to the SIR Book Exchange. If any of you have one of the 5 million copies, please consider donating it to the pile we are accumulating.

I was curious about a couple other books I have read so I looked them up. *The Lost World* by Michael Crichton (ranked #7) was written in 1995 and sold over a million copies. And after I saw this--the scariest movie I have ever seen, I checked out *The Silence of the Lambs*, 1991 by Thomas Harris. It's just as scary to read. I'll see if I can "scare up" a copy of that one for our Book Exchange.

The September 15th wine tasting event was held at the home of Jay and Irene Muzio. There were five couples in attendance. This month was a little different from previous events. Rather than having a single varietal, we paired different wines

with selected See's candies. The following is the list of wines in the order in which they were favored by the tasters. I have also noted the suggested chocolate that goes with each wine.

- First place went to the Renquist Petit Sarah from Salmon Vineyard in Clarksburg (\$30). The Petit Sarah was paired with a dark chocolate chip truffle.
- Second place went to the Amancaya 2018 Malbec from Mendoza Argentina (\$23). The Malbec was paired with a deep dark chocolate truffle.
- Third place went to the Postmark 2019 Napa Merlot (\$29). The Merlot was paired with a dark salted caramel.
- Fourth place went to the Harebrained 2019 Napa Cabernet Sauvignon (\$40). The Cabernet was paired with a dark pecan bud.
- Fifth place went to the Tera D'oro 2019 Amador Zinfandel (\$26). The Zinfandel was paired with a dark raspberry cream.

A delicious potluck followed the wine tasting. The dishes included smoked pulled pork sandwiches, fresh green salad, potatoes three ways, mac-and-cheese and a fruit topped cheesecake.
