But if you're like me, you've seen just enough of the grey clouds, the bare trees, and most importantly <u>having to ride "cart path only" on the golf courses!</u>

Guess what? Just in time to help bring some optimism for those last dog days of Winter we've got a couple of great speakers at our February luncheon.

Our speakers for February will be **Vinny Jacobs**, head golf teaching professional and **Daniel Awe**, golf coach from Mather Golf Course. The presentation will not only pertain to current golfers but will include information for non golfers, past golfers and wanna'- be golfers. In addition to golf the presentation will include tips for stretching exercises and amusing stories from their many years of experience.



Vinny Jacobs is a native of Canton, Ohio. He started his golfing career by learning to caddy at a very early age, always saying, **"if a young person really wants to learn the game, they should try caddying, it is truly one of the best ways to learn the entire game."** He turned pro in 1996 while playing on the California Golf Tour. He has attended several PGA forums and many clinics conducted by some of the best instructors in the game, such as Butch Harmon, Dave Pelz, Gary Wiren, Hank Haney and many others. Vinny is also a certified club fitter with Titleist, Ping, Taylormade, and others. He has performed thousands of individual lessons in all age categories. In 2005 and 2006, he led the city golf courses in all group lessons.



Over the past 10 plus years **Daniel Awe** has given over 10,000 lessons to golfers ranging from beginner to expert level. As the former Director of Instruction at Cold Springs Country Club, he created a junior program to prepare young golfers for success in tournament golf and how to use golf to achieve success in other aspects of their lives.

Daniel has dedicated himself to understanding why tour pros are tour pros from a physical, mental and statistical standpoint. His goal with every lesson is to deliver factual information to help his students improve, based on them having a better understanding and a tailored plan on what's required to hit any desired shot more often. Daniel has played the game for over 20 years

with a career low round of 64. He is a former Long Drive competitor with a longest drive of 445 yards in competition. However, his favorite part of golf is putting and shots hit from 100 yards and in. Daniel's motto is "success in golf is found in understanding the milliseconds and micro-movements of the swing."

As I was putting the finishing touches on this month's newsletter, I received an email from Lew with the Google Form to register for the February meeting. Do you recall back in the day when we had callers? It was more personal but very inefficient. The ever changing membership list was divided up amongst the ever changing number of volunteer callers so each had roughly the same number of members to call each month. There were missed calls, frequent voicemails if the member had that capability and calls that weren't returned that required multiple call backs. On the registration deadline, callers had to contact the organizer with their counts and unavoidable, last minute changes so the organizer could tally the final headcount. Today, simple technology exists that handles all of that in the form of Google Forms. The counts are always up-to-date and available to luncheon organizers making it a whole lot easier when it comes time each month to inform Cameron Park Country Club of our final headcount. BRANCH 95 GOLF | Terry Starkel, Golf Chairman 916-817-1524



As we start the 2024 golf season, I would like to welcome the newer members of our group and review some of the procedures we have set up for our golf group for everyone. Each golf course tournament director will send out

emails requesting golfers to sign up for that tournament. For Empire Ranch and the 4th Tuesdays, that would be me. For Mather, Dennis Petersen will be handling the tournaments and, for Wildhawk, it will be Ron Wadsworth.

We would like members to reply as soon as possible. Some courses require us to have our numbers in 8 to 14 days in advance, with the final list of players 3 to 5 days in advance of the tournament. Mather and Diamond Oaks require us to make one payment to the course, so you will need to bring cash for the tournament director so he can then pay the fees for the entire group.

For each tournament, we collect \$3 from each player that has an NCGA handicap, to split among the top three or four places, depending on how many golfers we have playing. We also give out a sleeve of golf balls to the golfer that gets closest to the pin on the designated hole. You must be present at the end of the round to collect. Part of the SIR golf experience is the fellowship that occurs before, during and after the golf.

In September, we will have our Club Championship which consists of three rounds of golf at the three main courses we play. The lowest total score from these three rounds determines the Club Champion. All SIR 95 golf members that have played at least 10 rounds with the group during the season is eligible to play for the Club Championship. Golf members that have not played 10 rounds may still play, but will not be eligible to be Champion. We also have the Gold Country Cup, which is awarded to the player with the most points



(accumulated from 1st through 4th place finishes at the weekly tournaments depending on the number of places awarded). We also have the Marksman of the Year award for the player that had the most closest to the pin wins during the season.

A reminder to all of our golfers, especially our newer members that may not be aware of how we handle bad weather. A decision is usually not made until the day before play as to whether we need to cancel. If it looks like a high percentage possibility of rain during our play, we will send out a notice that we are canceling. If the course is going to have cart path only, we will give players the option of canceling if we can. Some courses are more demanding than others and, unless they deem it unsafe to play, they want us to play. I always approach these courses with the fact that most of our players are in the 70's and 80's and it is the health and safety of our players that we must consider first. We have not had too much trouble canceling in the past as we have been

> good at maintaining a good relationship with each of the courses and keeping communications open.

Also, we are going to try to speed up play of our group this year. Please be ready to hit when it is your turn, play ready golf and help keep an eye on each others' shots to reduce time looking for a ball in the wrong location. Also, two people should be keeping score and comparing scores at

the end of 9 and 18 holes to be sure they match and resolving any differences. We will be trying to make out two set of scorecards for each group, so they will already be made out in the same order and with the handicaps listed for the group's players.

I hope everyone is ready to shake off the winter rust and start the new year looking forward to enjoying the game of golf. I wish everyone a good, safe and enjoyable golf season this year and, remember, our golf rounds are supposed to be fun and enjoyable, even if our golf game is not what we would like it to be.
