## THIS MONTH IN HISTORY | Randy Scott 916-834-9475

**1777:** John Adams introduced a resolution before Congress mandating a United States flag, stating, "...that the flag of the thirteen United States shall be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white on a blue field, representing a new constellation." This anniversary is celebrated each year in the U.S. as Flag Day.

**1944:** D-Day, the largest amphibious landing in history, began in the early-morning hours as Allied forces landed in Normandy on the northern coast of France. Operation Overlord took months of planning and involved 1,527,000 soldiers in 47 Allied divisions along with 4,400 ships and landing craft, and 11,000 aircraft.

**1966:** The U.S. Supreme Court ruled (5-4) in the case of Miranda v. Arizona that an accused person must be apprised of certain rights before police questioning including the right to remain silent, the right to know that anything said can be used against the individual in court, and the right to have a defense attorney present during interrogation. American police officers now routinely read prisoners their 'Miranda' (constitutional) rights before questioning.

**1971:** The 26th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was enacted, granting the right to vote in all federal, state and local elections to American citizens 18 years or older. The U.S. thus gained an additional 11 million voters. The minimum voting age in most states had been 21.

**1978:** By a vote of almost two to one, California voters approved Proposition 13, an amendment to the state constitution severely limiting property tax rates.

Despite the purchasing challenge, the tasters obtained and wrapped fourteen bottles for judging. Bottles came from California, Oregon, Washington, Germany and France. The first-place winner was a 2022 Fetzer (white label) presented by Jim and Carol Peterson. Second place was another 2022 Fetzer (blue label) presented by George and Micki Alboff.

The food complementing the wine was excellently prepared, resulting in the consumption of twelve pounds of pulled pork served with Brioche Buns. The pork was served with coleslaw, mixed green salad, fresh fruit and macaroni salad. In addition to a vegetarian plate, there were fantastic hors d'oeuvres to start the snacking and tasting of Gewürztraminer. The evening ended with tasty desserts that included Boston Cream Pie, Blueberry / Strawberry folded pastries and other goodies like homemade cookies.

All tasters parted with smiles and laughter about 9 pm, walking steadily and down the front steps.

DJ Peterson has offered the Shangri-La restaurant in Fair Oaks which is owned and run by he and his daughter – maybe mostly by his daughter. 
## **BOWLING** | Ray DiBasilio, HLM (Branch 113) 530-558-9727
